PILOT PROGRAMS!



We have launched TWO pilot programs to help tenants work toward homeownership!

LEASE-TO-OWN

We have a lease-to-own house that has been purchased with funds from Opportunity Lenders and donors. Over time, the tenant will earn a "credit" toward the purchase price from their rental payments, and in a few years will be able to afford a conventional mortgage.

WHAT MAKES IT DIFFERENT?

The sellers sold to Urban Hope at significantly under market value so that our affordable rents would be able to cover the operating costs and still produce the "credit" for the future homebuyer. The difference between the appraisal and our purchase price is tax deductible for the seller, since they sold to a 501(c)3.

We have a newly acquired house that was a friendly, "premarket" sale from a neighborhood resident who likes our mission. We also have a generous family looking for a "legacy project" that will make a lasting impact toward Black homeownership; they are gifting the funds for the house so it will carry no debt, giving UH flexibility to develop the house as a tool to facilitate their goal.

WHAT MAKES IT DIFFERENT?

Since the house carries no debt, UH's operating costs are lower. We charge prospective homeowners an appropriate level of rent, commensurate with 30-33% of their income. The difference between the operating costs and the total rent gets allocated to an escrow account and a credit improvement plan, preparing the tenants over time to become homeowners out in the open market. Then the cycle repeats with another family!

COHORT UPDATE!
